Members of the ASK Amateur Radio Club will have free membership to the HDARC up to age 18 as long as they belong to the ASK Amateur Radio Club and be invited to attend all club functions and special events

Provide assistance in applying and maintaining official ARRL Club status and application for a Club Call sign with the FCC.

Once ARRL Club status is achieved the HDARC will provide and set up a Club transceiver at the ASK Academy Provide ongoing technical assistance to the club

Advise and demonstrate to the club the different aspects of amateur radio and radio sport and how this craft can carry with them on any career path they choose in life.

Advice and provide opportunities to explore the different avenues of Amateur Radio that involve programming, engineering, math, earth and space science, and public service.
