

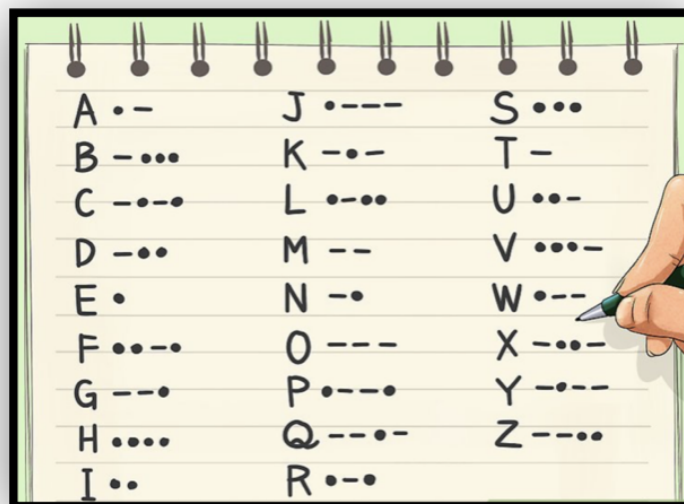
# First Steps to Learning Morse Code

**Group #3:** R, K, O, S (RKO, SOS, SOAK, SAM, SAT, TOM, MOM, ...)

**Group #4:** D, U, G, W, Z (DUG, DIG, ZIG, ZAG, WAG, KID, RIG, ZOO(

**Group #5:** C, P, X, L. (CALL, KICK, LICK, XL, LAK, CAT, PAL, LINE...)
